- ^{6.1)} What are the strengths of this course?
- Dr. Petrovich is very timely regarding grading work and responding to emails. I appreciate her involvement in the discussion boards and how closely discussions and study guides relate to exam material, which helps students feel prepared. Overall, she does a great job, and the effort she puts into her course does not go unrecognized.

- The work is spread out enough through the due sates to have plenty of time to finish the assignments in a timely fashion, and the professor answers emails extremely fast with needed information.
- There's a lot of interesting information throughout the course and I learned a lot from the student discussions as well as the instructor's.
- This course is great because it does not overload students with busy work. Students have time to themselves to complete criteria for other classes and are given an adequate amount of time to complete this class's requirements. Assignments are fairly simple and strait forward and the class itself is interactive and fun for those of us who partake in learning. The professor is good with response time and gives helpful feedback when challenged with a question.

- One change that I would recommend that would improve the course is clearly specifiying when students should or should not include citations in an assignment. At times, it is unclear when a citation is needed or not, but Professor Petrovich is speedy in her email responses and properly clarifies any miscommunication regarding this dilemma.
- There is a lack of variety in instructional methods (students' only instruction comes from discussion boards and the textbook). Hence, I think many students would agree that integrating lecture videos or PowerPoint presentations into course instruction would better foster student understanding and lessen the redundancy of the course. Finally, I found the discussion boards particularly helpful in the last couple of weeks preceding their due dates because this is when most students started to post on them. However, I think it would have been more beneficial if students had started the discussion sooner instead of being allowed to procrastinate until the last minute. To combat this and make the discussion boards more interactive, the professor may consider making intermittent deadlines on the posts (e.g. having the first post be due by the third or fourth week of class rather than all of the posts being due the day before the exam).
