





I had to resort to outside of class/college resources for nearly every assignment. Answers to coding questions are very hard to find good answers for when the professor doesn't provide them for the specific example needed.

- I was willing to forgive you for not being well prepared at the beginning of the course because of your COVID situations. However, your lack of preparedness continued throughout the entire semester. Nearly everything you posted was copy-pasted from previous professors' materials and was not even checked for out-of-date references and sometimes even random unrelated information. There were also several times you stated to have provided resources that in fact were never provided (Once you even had to push back a due date on an assignment because of this). I know from communicating with other students in this course that they were having many of the same problems with the course as I was, and none of us were getting any help from you. It took far too long for you to reply to any concerns by email. it is perfectly fine to use materials from previous instructors of the course, that is not what I am faulting you for. I am stating that it should be thoroughly combed over and ensured to all be accurate and sufficient for current use. Dates were consistently wrong and information was either wrong or missing often. Nearly every assignment I spent nearly as much time figuring what I was supposed to be doing as I did doing it. I have had a lot of excellent experiences at BC, and a lot of great professors and counselors. You may not be a bad professor either, but for whatever reasons you may have, this semester was not an enjoyable experience in the slightest. I can understand you have a large workload also, but don't overcommit yourself with positions you can't handle in that case. Students are relying on you to provide us with the knowledge and expertise we need to advance in our careers, and we were not given that in this course.
