- ^{6.1)} What are the strengths of this course?
- Lots of information and direction

- ^{6.2)} What changes would you recommend that would improve this course?
- I would lighten the workload a bit. I don't see how the students who have 40 hr work weeks plus kids are able to get all of this done on time, especially when you are taking other classes.
- I've never had a course with this much work due each week. I would remove either the weekly self assessment for the end of semester journal project as they seem very redundant.
- Less research and structure in the discussion will allow more honest communication about our knowledge. As it is right now, all of the research, and the way it is supposed to be structured causes it to be more of a paper. That does not allow time for me to learn, because I'm spending so much time writing this "paper". While reading the chapters, we have skill assessment, quizzes that need to be completed. I find those helpful. However, then we are required to write a paper about our learnings and our deficiencies, and what we can do to improve upon them. At this point I do have, a decent skill set in leadership, so I find that my deficiencies are repeated weekly. I am hyper aware of what I need to work on. I think that the quizzes are helpful but instead of writing a paper on them every week, they should be used as material for us in our leadership journals, which intern will give us information for our professional plan.
- Make directions and rubrics more consistent, less workload, less surprises
- Most of our work comes from assessing the quizzes and it gets a little repetitive. I also feel like the work load is to much. I understand that this is an 8wk upper division course, but I am spending way more that 9hrs on homework.
- The instructions seemed to be lacking in some areas and left me struggling to find all of the information needed. The first few weeks it was difficult to navigate.
