





- 6.1) What are the strengths of this course?
- Does contain information that might be helpful in my career, yet I might not be able to use it because I really don't understand it.
- Good material to review! The workload may be on the heavy side, but not too bad. It was manageable.
- Professor tries to help the class. When he seen we were struggling he held a town hall meeting to address concerns and answer any questions. Students are allowed to work at their pace without being rushed.
- 62) What changes would you recommend that would improve this course?
- More detailed instructions on term projects. Timely entering of grades. We are not seeing grades until 2-3 weeks after we submit. That does not give us time to adjust our approach to assignments based on the feedback we would receive from the professor. Because this is an 8-week class, the reading assignments were much more than I expected. Consider changing this to a 16-week class.
- Some of the instructions were not very clear. The Term projects had instructions but we were still confused on the specifics on what was being asked. For example, my specific issue used a type of tree that was different than the "main" tree. I did not know until after I had submitted my assignment and then I had to ask for clarity on the explanation which, the professor did give and cleared up.
- That the teacher actually teaches. This is the second class I have taken where the instructors expect you to teach yourself just by reading the book and watching videos. The teacher needs to film himself explaining step by step examples of the problems he wants us to solve as homework. He needs to guide us as to how the project needs to be put together or how to do it. Grades are given super late, feedback is vague. I am a very visual person who learns by watching and use the written materials as reference. This class has none of that, I am confused most of the time and I don't feel like I am learning much.
