COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Introduction to the use of the elements of art and principles of design. Line, value, color, form, texture, shape, space, and principles of composition are studied. Basic instruction in a variety of techniques and materials, including collage, drawing, painting and product design.

7. Manipulate two-dimensional materials in order to explore the expressive potential of line, shape and form, space, texture, pattern and value.

Assessment: Complete hands-on activities in art media as determined by instructor (passing with at least 70%)
