Course Description:

Beginning level class, no painting background required. We will be working just with watercolor, both dry and wet to explore both. Materials will be explored through assignments and lessons will be the beginning of the semester. Color, line, shape, value, texture, and space will be the focus during the 1st 8 weeks. By the mid-point students will have projects with more depth and that take longer to develop and complete. Composition will be the focus of the next 8 weeks. Students will also work on basic sketching to develop an under-drawing to paint upon.
