This course will introduce the student to a study of the role of corrections in the criminal justice system. Topics include organization and theory of correctional systems, institutional operations, management, alternatives to institutionalization, treatments and rehabilitation, and current and future issues.

Examinations.

There will be two (2) exams, a final exam, and quizzes throughout the semester.

The first exam will cover chapters 1 thru 5; the second exam will cover chapters 6 thru 11; and the final exam will cover chapters 12 thru 16. The exams will consist of multiple-choice, true-false and essay questions.

Any extra credit work will be in the form of a research paper. Papers will be graded on organization, content, grammar, and currency (recent sources). Observe the minimal requirements above.

Student Exercises.

Exercises may be required for this course. They are to be submitted to your instructor when you finish. In your written answer, be sure to speak directly to the question and use the format indicated.

Grading.

The exams will account for 60% of your final grade. The quizzes will account for 20%; and student discussion participation will account for 20%.
