Course Format

DRAM 1350 is a totally online class, which means there are no on-campus sessions. All communication, submission of assignments, discussions, and testing will take place within the online course. The course will be available on the very first day of the semester.

Each week you'll receive several assignments: a reading, a quiz on that reading, and either a short writing prompt or discussion starter. All discussions take place asynchronously online in a chat-like forum. All assignments are usually due on the Friday of each week at 11:30 PM.

Midterm Exam	10%	An exam covering all class material up to the date of the midterm. No proctoring or special browser required.
Final Exam	10%	An exam covering all class material. No proctoring or special browser required.
