D. Course Overview & Structure

This is a hybrid course that is both in person and web-based delivered through the Virtual Campus portal at Brazosport College. The web-based portion of this class runs on a 24/7 weekly schedule. I will respond to critical questions via email messages within reasonable hours Monday through Friday. Quizzes are auto-graded upon submission, when in D2L. Other assignments submitted via Dropbox will be graded automatically or as soon as reasonably practicable, based on the instructors' schedule and availability.

VI. ACADEMIC HONESTY

Brazosport College assumes that students eligible to perform on the college level are familiar with the ordinary rules governing proper conduct including academic honesty. The principle of academic honesty is that all work presented by you and is yours alone.

Academic dishonesty including, but not limited to, cheating, plagiarism, and collusion (unauthorized collaboration in preparing/copying any work offered for credit) shall be treated appropriately. Plagiarism is using another resource, author or entity's work or ideas without giving credit for the ideas or material they take from another resource or student. Plagiarism is dishonest because it misrepresents the work of another as your own. This includes both copying the work verbatim or re-phrasing the ideas of another without properly acknowledging the source. When preparing work for course requirements, students must be careful to differentiate between their ideas and language and information derived from other sources. VII. ATTENDANCE, PARTICIPATION AND WITHDRAWAL POLICIES If the student decides to WITHDRAW from the class, it is the responsibility of the student to initiate a withdrawal before the withdrawal deadline in order to receive a "W" on their transcript.

The Instructor may count tardiness as a partial absence. Since a significant part of the grade is based on class attendance, students are expected to be on time and attend the full class, until dismissed by the Instructor.

<u>Students who miss 3 or more classes in a fall or Spring Session will usually be assumed to</u> have abandoned the class and may be withdrawn immediately or before the last withdrawal date assigned by the college. After the last withdrawal date, a failing grade of "F" may be assigned for missing 3 or more classes and/or withdrawn from the class by the instructor. It is the Student's responsibility to immediately make timely contact</u> with the Instructor and explain any and all missed class time.

Since attendance is so important a part of the learning experience it has become necessary to modify the grading system. Full fall and Spring Semesters have typically about 15 weeks of classes depending on holidays and exams schedule. For regular classes that means about 12 weeks of educational activity aside from mid-term and finals. <u>Someone missing 3 classes</u> then has missed almost 25% of course content.

Students who miss 3 (three) or more classes will usually be assumed to have abandoned the class and may be withdrawn before the last withdrawal date assigned by the college.

After the last withdrawal date, a failing grade of "F" may be assigned for students missing 3 (three) or more classes and/or withdrawn from the class by the instructor.

Once a student has accrued 3 (three) absences, each absence thereafter will count as 2 (two) classes missed, or as determined by the instructor.

A total of 3 (three) late arrivals to class will be assigned a value of 1 (one) absence. Leaving early, or not leaving at all at the conclusion of an on-line virtual class, will result in an absence.

The final grade will be adjusted based on attendance : -3 points for excused absence; - 5 points for unexcused absence; or more/less depending on instructor discretion

IT IS THE STUDENT'S RESPONSIBILITY TO IMMEDIATELY MAKE TIMELY CONTACT WITH THE INSTRUCTOR AND EXPLAIN ANY AND ALL MISSED CLASS TIME.

VIII. COURSE REQUIREMENTS AND GRADING POLICY

There will be a total of three quizzes and one Final Exam. See below for grading requirements. The quizzes and exam will cover all materials assigned for the quiz or exam from the class meetings, including the assigned textbook readings, lectures, PowerPoint slide decks, in class activities and any handouts in class or online. Quizzes may be taken up to 2 times, with the average score being the final grade. The Final Exam will be **comprehensive**, will be proctored and can be taken only once. The Final Exam will be given at the end of the course, on campus in an assigned room. The exact date of each quiz and exam is noted in this syllabus and will be announced in class and/or online prior to the actual date of the exam.

There will be NO make-up quizzes or exams. A missed exam is a zero. An exception to this is when the instructor is notified prior to the quiz close date or the scheduled exam date <u>and</u> the instructor approves the rescheduled date. Exams must be rescheduled with Learning Services (979-230-3253). An email to the instructor requesting a rescheduled quiz or exam is typically sufficient.

IF the instructor accepts a late assignment, 20 points per day penalty will apply for each late assignment, for a maximum time of 5 days. Additional deductions may apply based on meeting the requirements of the assignment or at the instructor discretion. No assignment will be accepted after 5 days unless the instructor deems special circumstances apply and will grade at his/her discretion.

Assignments, Team Projects & Presentations

There will be seven individual assignments, two in class presentations and four team projects. See below for grading requirements.

Assignments, both individual and team project assignments, that have not been submitted by midnight on the due date will receive a zero. In class presentations not given on the scheduled date will receive a zero.

If a late submission or alternative presentation date has been requested <u>and</u> approved by the instructor prior to the due date, a penalty of 20 points per day will apply for a maximum time of 5 days. Additional deductions may apply based on meeting the requirements of the assignment or at the instructor discretion. No assignment will be accepted after 5 days unless the instructor deems special circumstances apply and will grade at his/her discretion. An email to the instructor requesting an extension of the due date or an alternative presentation date is typically sufficient.

Workshops

Students are required to attend one Workshop. Workshops will focus on resume' writing and interviewing preparation and will be held with the college's local industry partner representatives either at the industry partner's facility or at the college. *Failure to attend a Workshop and complete the Final Exam will result in Failure of the Course.*

- If you fail to submit assignment(s) or tests on time as specified the instructor for ENER 1240, a zero will be entered for the grade (see XIII.C above)! If the instructor accepts late work, 20 points per day penalty will apply for any assignment, for a maximum time of 5 days. Additional deductions may apply based on meeting the requirements of the assignment or at the instructor discretion. No assignment will be accepted after 5 days unless the instructor deems special circumstances apply and will grade at his/her discretion.
- You should make every effort to stay on track with the assignments, as it is very difficult to play "catch-up."
- If for any reason you should fall behind in your work, (illness, accident, temporary duty, company "turnaround", etc.) contact the instructor immediately.

- Any "Instructor Approved" extensions for exams/papers and assignments must be completed on the date assigned by the instructor. The instructor may approve submittals, but they must be made prior to the end of the scheduled term (FINAL EXAM). Any extension approved by the instructor and not met by the student may risk being graded zero for that work and run the risk of failure of the course.

- All electronic devices, including but not limited to cell phones, "Blackberry" e-mail type devices, I-Phones and PDA's MUST be turned completely off or **placed on vibrate for work-related callouts**. All electronic devices must be stored so that they are not visible in the classroom.
- Smart Watches shall not be accessed at any time for any reason during the class period (clocks are available in the classroom) and the instructor will advise the time for breaks and class dismissal. Cell phones and smart watches must be inside of the students' backpacks or other non-course items at all times.
- CELL PHONES WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO BE USED AS A CALCULATOR OR FOR ANY OTHER PURPOSE UNLESS APPROVED BY THE INSTRUCTOR!!!!!! Calculators are for sale in the BC Bookstore to support math problems.
- Cell phones visible in the classroom will result in 5 points subtracted from major exam grades
- Cheating via use of telecommunications devices (or any other sources) such as smart watches, cell phones, etc., will result in an immediate ZERO for the test involved and may result in further penalties.
- Cheating while at home taking online quizzes will not be tolerated. While it is difficult to monitor, a student is expected to be honest and ethical by taking the exam as per the instructor guidelines.
- Backpacks and other additional non-course materials carried into the classroom must be placed on the floor and out of walkways.
