

ENGLISH 1302: COMPOSITION AND RHETORIC II

Fall 2023 ONLINE

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Course Description

This course provides an introduction to reading, understanding, and evaluating literary text. This course is a continuation of Composition & Rhetoric I with a focus on fiction and media studies.

Course Materials

This class only uses free, online materials. An MLA handbook is an optional resource. Our film unit may require a rental (est. at about \$3.99).

Assignment: Mini Paper 1

1 page, structured like a long paragraph, no outside research, no works cited needed (but parentheticals/ in-text citation expected).

Assignment: Mini Paper 2

1 page, structured like a long paragraph, no outside research, no works cited needed (but parentheticals/ in-text citation expected).

Assignment: Short Film Essay

750 word minimum. Requires 1 critical source + primary source (short film) = 2 entries on the works cited page

Assignment: Film Research Essay

1,000 word minimum. This project includes a research component.

Final Exam: D2L, will be open notes (95 grade average will be exempt)
