Textbook:

The course textbook is *Precalculus Graphical, Numerical Algebraic* 7th edition, by Demana, Waits, Foley, and Kennedy.

Required Material:

Graphing Calculator TI-83 or better is required. It is the student's responsibility to have basic knowledge about using his/her own calculator.

Course Outcomes:

Upon completion of the course, the student will be able to:

- 1. Evaluate and graph piecewise defined functions.
- 2. Find rational, irrational, and complex zeros of a polynomial function.
- 3. Find the vertical, horizontal and/or oblique asymptotes of a rational function.
- 4. Decompose a rational expression into the sum of partial fractions.
- 5. Use a calculator to solve trigonometric equations.
- 6. Define and geometrically represent vectors.
- 7. Perform the operations of addition, subtraction, and scalar multiplication, with vectors.
- 8. Graph a parametric equations
- 9. Graph and give important features of ellipses and hyperbolas.
- 10. Plot and convert between rectangular and polar coordinates
- 11. Evaluate difference quotient
- 12. Advanced factoring that occurs in calculus

Assessments:

During the semester there will be several on-line quizzes and Homework, six (6) Tests (2 in class and 4 on-line) and one Final Exam (in class).

Any written open-answer assessment must contain all the steps performed in order to get the solution and must be presented in a mathematical methodical manner. <u>No make up work is allowed unless extraordinary circumstances by providing official documents</u>.

It is the student responsibility to check and to complete the homework before the each due date. There is limited number of time where students can work on each problem. If the homework will not be completed the student will accumulate a zero for it. The homework has no time constrain and you can work each question 4 (four) times. No Make-up is allowed.

<u>Quizzes</u>:

There will be several quizzes assigned on-line on the web site: <u>http://www.coursecompass.com</u>. It is the student responsibility to check and to complete the on-line quizzes before the due date for each. The on-line quizzes can be completed in <u>within forty (40) minutes and each question has two (2) attempts</u>. <u>No make-up is allowed</u>. The average of quizzes worth 15% from the final grade!

Tests:

<u>**Two(2) Tests</u>** will be administrated in the regular class. They will be open-answer questions where the students are required to show all the work performed on the tests' paper in a methodical and mathematical manner. The tests administrate in class have the following tentative schedule:</u>

<u>Four(4) Tests</u> will be scheduled on-line and they will be limited at 80 minutes and 2 attempts for each question. There will be a due date for each on-line test. It is the student's responsibility to complete the test before the due date. The on-line tests have the following tentative schedule:
