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Course Description

Brazosport College Chamber Singers is an auditioned choral ensemble that performs music of many eras and many styles.

Course Objectives

- Students will reflect critically upon personal performance and performances by others.
- Students will strengthen individual vocal, aural, and music literacy skills.
- Students will engage in the creative process through interpretive performance.
- Students will understand choral works studied as expressions of human values in historical and social contexts.
- Students will articulate informed aesthetic reactions to choral works studied.
- Students will employ interpersonal communication skills on a daily basis.
- Students will work with others harmoniously as a member of a team.

Required Textbook

Cole, Samuel and Leo R. Lewis. *Melodia: A Course in Sight-Singing Solfeggio, Complete (Books I-IV)*. Bryn Mawr, PA: Presser, 1904.

We will use this book to improve our sight-singing. It may be downloaded and printed or viewed on a tablet. Either in print or electronically, you must have the entire book ready when we start class each day. Required course materials are available at the Brazosport College bookstore, on campus or online at <http://www.brazosport.edu/bookstore>. A student of this institution is not under any obligation to purchase a textbook from the college bookstore. The same textbook is/may also be available from an independent retailer, including an online retailer.

Required Materials (Bring to class DAILY)

- Black, 1-inch, 3-ring binder with no clear plastic cover and no writing/graphics on the outside
- Music scores borrowed from the BC Choral library (you will be charged for scores damaged, destroyed, or not returned)
- Pencil (do NOT mark your music with pen!)

Other Required Materials

- Metronome, tuner, and voice recorder (or metronome, tuner, and voice recorder apps of your choice)
- Computer with internet access

Grading

All students begin the semester with 100 points. Points will be subtracted for the following:

Absence from regular rehearsal, <u>for any reason</u> , starting with the fifth absence:	5 points
Unexcused absence from an extra rehearsal	10 points
Unexcused absence from a dress rehearsal	20 points
Absence from a concert or performance, with documented illness/emergency	20 points
Unexcused absence from a concert or performance	40 points
Tardy	1 point
Missing binder and/or music	3 points
Missing class supplies (pencil, Melodia, etc)	2 points
Negative contribution to the group (director's discretion)	1-40 points
"Needs improvement" on a progress check or written assignment	2 points

Points may be added for the following:

Service to the choral area, at director's discretion	1-10 points
Attendance at Thursday evening Civic Chorus rehearsals, at director's discretion	1-10 points
Superior performance on a progress check or written assignment	2 points

Grading Scale:

90-100 = A 80-89 = B 71-79 = C 61-69 = D 60 or below = F

Participation Guidelines

- Participate energetically and positively with good alignment that supports excellent singing.
- Bring all required materials to every rehearsal and performance.
- Follow instructions and dutifully mark scores.
- Respond favorably to constructive criticism.
- Demonstrate respect for the conductor, collaborative artists, and fellow singers.
- Take ownership of the ensemble by submitting notes to the director, as needed.
- Attend all concerts and performances with proper attire.
- Attend other BC music events whenever possible to support fellow musicians.
- Use cell phones and other technology only to support learning directly. All electronic devices should be turned off before entering the rehearsal space. Ordinarily, only section leaders (attendance) and the Daily DJ (music) may have cell phones out.

Attendance Guidelines

- Punctuality and attendance are qualities expected of every musician. Regular attendance is crucial to success.
- Any student not participating fully at the beginning of class (12:30pm, promptly) will be assessed a **tardy**.
- If you are unable to sing, you should email Mr. May before the rehearsal begins. You should sit in the section and mark your score.
- If you miss eight or more classes and/or have twelve or more tardies in one semester, for any reason, you may be required to attend performances without singing, or you may be removed from the ensemble, at the director's discretion.
- Both excused and unexcused absences count as absences. If you know you are going to be absent, please notify the instructor by email as soon as possible.

- If you are absent, it is your responsibility to inquire about make-up work and materials covered in class. You are responsible for score markings made while you are absent.
- 20% is deducted from late written or recorded assignments that are turned in by the next class period following the due date. Work will not be accepted after 24 hours past the due date except in extenuating circumstances, which require documentation and exist at the director's discretion.
- Students must inform the director of any conflict with a required choir event by the end of the **third class meeting (1/16)** to avoid grade penalties. The director may assign a supplemental assignment for such cases.

Other Guidelines

- Keep a **calendar** with all of your dates—academic, work, and social.
- If in doubt, **email** Mr. May!!! It doesn't matter how trivial. If there's a chance you will miss class, be late, have a surprise birthday party, etc... send an email!

Academic Honesty
