#### **GENERAL OBJECTIVES**

To prepare, rehearse and perform jazz, popular, country and other musical styles in small vocal and instrumental ensemble setting.

## LEARNING OUTCOMES

Singers will be taught the following skills:

- 1. Microphone technique
- 2. Sound system set-up
- 3. Vocal techniques for "pop" and jazz singing
- 4. Vocal improvisation
- 5. Preparing ensemble music
- 6. Proper performance behavior and skills

Students who complete the course satisfactorily will experience music preparation for performance and performance/entertainment responsibilities and skills.

## REQUIRED TEXTBOOKS

There is no required textbook.

#### **EVALUATIONS**

Grade component

Attendance and punctuality at rehearsals and performances is required.

Grade Percentages:

40% - Class attendance and punctuality

50% - Attendance and participation in all performances

10% - Singing Quizzes

## **ATTENDANCE**

Students are allowed **three free absences**. Each absence beyond three will result in minus five points off the student's final grade for the semester. Students must be in their place and prepared for class (have music and a pencil) at the class start time. **Three tardies equal one absence**. The instructor will attempt to accommodate students for extenuating circumstances. For performance call times, students must be prepared and in their places at the designated time to earn full credit for the performance grade.

## **Singing Quizzes**

Due to the volume of repertoire that Jazz Singers will need to learn this semester, at times students may be asked to prepare for and take singing quizzes. Further details regarding singing quizzes will come at a later time and their use is also contingent on rehearsal progress in class.

NOTE: individual student score preparation outside of class will reduce the need for and number of singing quizzes during the semester. Quizzes will be assigned as needed.

Additionally, singing quizzes may be conducted outside of class if rehearsal time is limited. In these cases the instructor and student will schedule a separate time to do the quiz.

## **Student Responsibility**

Jazz Singers is a class for skilled singers and will require the learning and preparation of challenging repertoire. As such, students are encouraged to rehearse the music on their own outside of class. The instructor will communicate how students should be preparing for class and which pieces, and or excerpts to focus on. Students are encouraged to work together in groups outside of class.

# **Additional Rehearsals**

The instructor reserves the right to schedule additional rehearsals outside of normal class time. The instructor will strive to give students as much advance notice as possible and to accommodate students should scheduling conflicts arise. Additional rehearsals will be scheduled as needed and only under time intensive, performance-related demands.

#### COURSE EVALUATION
