COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Speech 1318, Interpersonal and Small Group Communication, examines on an introductory level the theory and research behind interpersonal communication. It is not a public speaking class. We will learn about the communication process, self-concept, perception, language, nonverbal communication, listening, types of relationships and the influence of culture, sex, and gender on relationships. Hopefully, we will learn to improve our communication and thus our lives.

- 1. Understand the communication process and how it affects understanding and misunderstanding
- 2. Exhibit understanding of interpersonal theories, principles, and vocabulary
- 3. Demonstrate critical thinking skills by applying theories to communication situations in written and oral assignments.
- 4. Reflect in writing on our own interpersonal communication for understanding and improvement
- 5. Identify types and barriers to effective listening
- 6. Develop mindfulness about our relational communication in personal, professional, and societal settings
